

**SAN JUAN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO
ORDINANCE NO. 107**

REPEALING SAN JUAN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO ORDINANCE NO. 102, ADOPTED ON AUGUST 7, 2018, RELATING TO PROMOTION OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND COMMERCE BY REGULATION OF CERTAIN INVOLUNTARY PAYMENTS REQUIRED OF EMPLOYEES IN SAN JUAN COUNTY, ALSO REFERRED TO AS "RIGHT TO WORK."

WHEREAS, on August 7, 2018, the San Juan County Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance No. 102, relating to promotion of economic development and commerce by regulation of certain involuntary payments required of employees in San Juan County, also referred to as "right to work"; and

WHEREAS, the New Mexico State Legislature, in its 2019 session, enacted Section 50-4-35 (2019) regarding union security agreements; and


WHEREAS, Section 50-4-35(C) (2019) states: "The state has exclusive jurisdiction to prohibit the negotiation, execution or application of agreements requiring membership in a labor organization as a condition of employment in New Mexico"; and

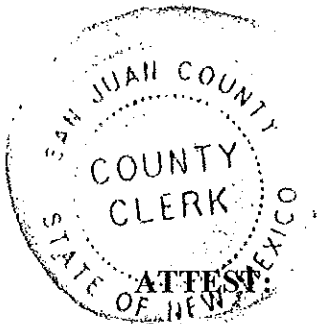
WHEREAS, Section 50-4-35(C) (2019) renders Ordinance No. 102 invalid, the Board of County Commissioners desires to repeal an invalid Ordinance currently on the books.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF SAN JUAN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, that San Juan County Ordinance No. 102 is hereby repealed.

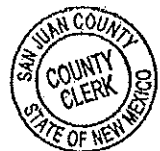
